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Justice Henry duPont Ridgely re-elected to the House of Delegates
of the American Bar Association

Justice Henry duPont Ridgely of the Delaware Supreme Court has been re-elected to the House of Delegates of the American Bar Association as the Conference Delegate of The Appellate Judges Conference of the Judicial Division. The Appellate Judges Conference includes state and federal appellate judges, appellate lawyers, and staff attorneys from across the country. The House of Delegates is the policy making body of the ABA and votes on issues affecting the Association and the legal profession. It consists of 566 members from State and local bar associations, ABA affiliates and ABA entities. Justice Ridgely was first elected to the House of Delegates in 2008. His new three-year term begins September 1, 2011. His election as the Conference Delegate means he also will continue to serve as an officer on the Executive Committee of the Appellate Judges Conference of the Judicial Division.
