The Honorable Tamika R. Montgomery-Reeves takes the Oath of Office for Vice Chancellor of the Delaware Court of Chancery

The Honorable Tamika R. Montgomery-Reeves was publicly sworn in for her first term as a Vice Chancellor of the Delaware Court of Chancery at 1:30 p.m. on Dec. 11, 2015 in Courtroom 12B at the New Castle County Courthouse in Wilmington.

Chancellor Andre G. Bouchard welcomed the audience to the investiture and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Nyla Crayton, Micah Marshal, Allena Montgomery and Ja'Nya Reeves, nieces and the sisterin-law of Vice Chancellor Montgomery-Reeves. The invocation was performed by the Vice Chancellor's uncle, Pastor Toney Montgomery. Vice Chancellor Sam Glasscock III administered the Oath of Office as the Vice Chancellor's husband Jeffrey Reeves, and her son Jackson, held the Bible. The oath was observed by her parents, Bettye Cribbs and Dewery and Caroline Montgomery; and her parents-in-law, LaDell Reeves and Alan and Lisa Reeves.

Vice Chancellor Montgomery-Reeves replaces Vice Chancellor Donald F. Parsons Jr., who retired from the bench in October.

Following the Oath of Office, Gov. Jack A. Markell, former Chancellor William B. Chandler III and Douglas J. Clark, Esq. of Wilson Sonsini Goodrich & Rosati, offered remarks.

Prior to her appointment, Vice Chancellor Montgomery-Reeves was a partner at Wilson Sonsini Goodrich & Rosati, where she focused on corporate governance, navigation of corporate fiduciary duties, and corporate litigation. Prior to joining that firm, the Vice Chancellor practiced in the securities and corporate governance department of Weil, Gotshal & Manges LLP. Vice Chancellor Montgomery-Reeves has been recognized for her pro bono contribution to the Prisoners' Rights Project and previously served as a law clerk for former Chancellor William B. Chandler III.

Vice Chancellor Montgomery-Reeves graduated from University of Georgia School of Law and received her Bachelor's Degree magna cum laude from the University of Mississippi. She currently resides in Wilmington with her husband and their son.
