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## EVALUATION

If you believe your child's difficulty in school is related to an undiagnosed learning disability or disorder, fill out the Parent Request Evaluation form. From there, you will work together with a team to determine if your child is eligible for special education. If eligible, you will then work together to create an individualized education plan (IEP) that suits your child's needs.



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## DISCIPLINE




In most cases, schools follow their own code of conduct when dealing with disciplinary action. If your child has an IEP or 504 plan, you may ask for a Manifestation Determination Hearing (MDR) to determine if the misbehavior was related to your child's disability or the school's failure to follow the IEP. If the MDR shows the child's misbehavior is related to their disability, the school will not be allowed to suspend (for more than ten days), expel, or transfer your child to a different school.
