KENT COUNTY PROTHONOTARY

Effective Tuesday, September 5, 2006, the Kent County Superior Court will allow judgments and execution writs to be filed electronically via LexisNexis^m File & Serve.

This is only on cases, which are subject to Civil Rule 16.1, but the value of the case is over \$100,000.00. (Non-Arbitration Cases which have been certified.)

Currently the practice is that once a judgment is filed on an e-file case, the judgment is accepted, and then printed and manually entered into the Court's civil case management system. The attorney then conventionally files the hard copies of the *praecipe* and writs with the Prothonotary's Office. (These documents are not be scanned.)

As of September 5, 2006, the attorney will now e-file these documents and once they are submitted and accepted by the court, the attorney will be notified and then hand deliver the hard copies to the Prothonotary's Office, along with the Sheriff's fees. The fees will then be delivered to the appropriate Sheriff's Department for service by the Prothonotary staff.
